Albion Area Library Awarded Keystone Grant

\$760,000.00 Awarded to Albion From Erie County Municipal Infrastructure GAP Funding

Thursday April 14, 2022, the Erie County Municipal Infrastructure GAP Funding grant was awarded to Albion Borough for the amount of \$760,000.00. This grant is part of the County's Build a Better Future.

Borough Manager, Gary Wells, applied for the Erie County Municipal Infrastructure GAP Funding grant to help complete the Gage water infrastructure project. The Borough's public water system is completely supplied by shallow water wells which are located outside of Albion Borough. In February 2018, the Borough of Albion contracted with Groundwater Resources to locate potential well supplies. A new test well with potential adequate yield was located. After many tests, Albion Borough received the final D.E.P. approval necessary to start production of the new well (SR-18). The GAP funding will assist in completing the water infrastructure project which includes: 1,100 ft. well supply main line & valves, electrical services, 3,000 ft. main transmission line, valves hydrants, engineering, permitting, construction administration, and inspection. The water treatment department's main objective is to continually stay ahead of the

the need for clean water. As required by all public water systems, Albion Borough's Water Department follows a rigorous water quality standards set by and monitored by the Pennsylvania



Department of Environmental Protection. The Albion Water Department's goal is to identify and eliminate any threat that could impact the Borough's water supply to our residents, neighboring communities, and businesses.
