Pennsylvania Snowfall

Heaviest Snowfall Hits Northwest Corner of PA

Public Works Department Foreman, William Snow, and his crew were out plowing and salting, trying to keep the roads cleared as massive amounts of snow continued to accumulate.

Albion Borough's Public Works Department knew a storm was coming, they were prepared to come out in the early hours to

begin plowing and salting the roadways. When the snow began to fall, it fell hard and fast making it difficult for the plows to keep up. "My crew worked hard to keep the streets cleared and salted. Our priority was keeping the roadways as clear as possible." stated Foreman

The National Weather Service announced snow had fell at a rate of 1 to 2 inches per hour. Erie County has received 40.2 inches of snow accumulation for 2022. Prior to the storms, this area has enjoyed a very mild winter with very little snow accumulation.

As more snow is predicted to hit our area, the Public Works Department asks residents to be patient as they continue to clean snow off the roadways and to please keep their vehicles off the roadways from 2:30am to 6am.
